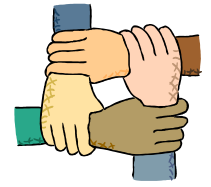

Working bee

Mr Land and the rest of the Environment committee would like to extend their thanks to all parents and children for their efforts during the working bee. Once again the Cammeray community spirit showed itself and we were able to finish a huge job in less than half the predicted time. More than twenty families were represented at the event and we managed to fill 12 cubic metres of garden beds and weed about 50 square metres of previously inaccessible playground. Each garden bed required approximately 20 trips with the wheelbarrow from the other side of Zone four. In addition to this we filled up most of the big, blue bin with bidens pilosa, [asthma weed](#) and other unwanted plants.

We would like to extend our thanks and apologies to any parents and children who turned up on Sunday to find a sign saying the working bee was finished. There will be more opportunities to be involved! The garden beds will now be used by year two students this Thursday to plant peas and broad beans currently sprouting in the school nursery.

School sustainability

The push for sustainability within the school is gathering pace with the year two students bringing excellent sustainable lunches to school. Year five and six are involved with assessing the school operations and coming up with plans for improving our sustainability.

CAMMERAY AWARD SYSTEM

Cammeray Public School currently has an award system based on points. The entire school participates and the system continues across grades throughout a student's time at Cammeray. It rewards all aspects of the children's daily school life from classroom contribution and playground behaviour to participation in various activities, and citizenship.

1. **Good Work Cards (GWC)** are worth **1 point** and reward everyday success.
2. When **10 GWC** have accumulated they can be traded in to the class teacher for a **Merit Award**, worth **10 points**.
Students may keep their GWC until they have any multiple of 10 and trade them for the corresponding number of Merit Awards. To save time and resources, teachers may write out a Merit Award for 10, 20, 30, 40 or 50 points.
3. **Book Awards** are given out in weekly class Assembly and are worth **5 points**.
4. An **A-Day** or **A-Night Certificate** is worth **10 points**.
These are awarded at A-Day/Night ceremonies for a specific branch of learning or activity and are separate from the Certificate of Achievement sent out in the mail (see below).

When a student has collected **50 points worth of any combination** of the above awards they should take them to their **class teacher**. The teacher will mark the awards (with a stamp or their initials), return them to the student to take home and record the points on the school computer system.

Any multiple of 50 is acceptable in which case the student will receive more than 1 award according to the amount of points – for example a student with 150 points worth of awards will receive 3 Certificates of Achievement.

For each 50 points recorded by the teacher students receive a special **Certificate of Achievement by mail**. The points are checked periodically by administrative staff (usually about once per month) and the students' names are published in the Newsletter.

When five of these Certificates of Achievement (i.e. 250 points) have been accumulated they should be taken to the class teacher to be sighted and recorded on the school computer system as a **Cammeray School Pennant**.

Students who have qualified for School Pennants have their names published in the Newsletter along with other students receiving Certificates of Achievement. Students receive their School Pennant in whichever term they have had their 250 points recorded in the class A-Day ceremony for terms 1-3 and in term 4, a special School Pennant assembly.

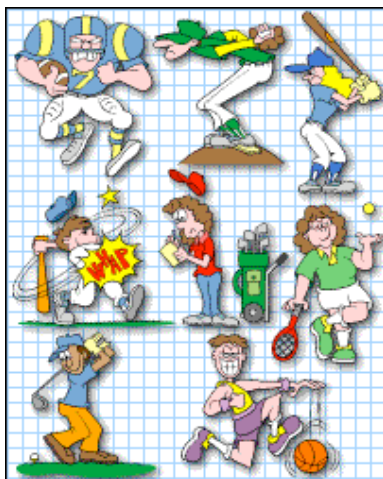
